The picture to the left shows a hoverfly, a perfect example of Batesian mimicry. They use this survival tactic to disguise themselves as a bee, wasp or even a hornet in order to deter predators and humans. Despite this, like most flies, they do not bite or sting. George has also written a letter to you, to help spread some joy.


It reads:
